 Created to promote business activity and enhance property values in downtown Peekskill in 1995 including events, beautification, marketing, and business advocacy.






#### **BID BACKGROUND**



- St. Patrick's Parade raised \$500 to put towards the parade

- Surprise visit by NYS Governor Kathy Hochel
  - •Fresh produce sales were up 10% over 2023;
- Other vendors sales were down up to 20%, primarily due to the economy/inflation



CODE ENFORCEMENT GUIDELINES for DOWNTOWN BID Building Department 840 Main Street Peekskill, NY 10566 (914) 734-4143

The City of Peekskill Code Enforcement monitors and enforces the City Code as it pertains to sidewalk, properly maintenance and sanitation violations. Some facts you should know as a property owner/tenant/business owner in the BID are:

#### Property/Business Owners' Responsibility

As a property owner/tenant/business owner you are responsible to keep the entire sidewalk area abutting your property free of litter, debris and rubbish. All overgrowth of vegetation, grass and/or weeds must be maintained to a maximum height of 10 inches. As per the City Code, the area to be kept clean extends to the curb.

#### Garbage & Recycling Schedule

\*\* Property owners are responsible for ensuring that tenants are following code guidelines \*\*

\*\* THERE WILL NO LONGER BE PICKUP ON SUNDAYS \*\*

Regular BID garbage is picked up daily; Monday - Saturday

- It is recommended to place all trash in clear or blue garbage bags
- All trash shall be placed in front of their property, at the road's edge on the morning of pickup from 6 – 10 am
- NO BAGS SHALL BE STORED ALONG SIDEWALK OVERNIGHT

Cardboard and paper are picked up every Monday, Wednesday & Friday

- It is recommended to place all cardboard and paper recycling in clear or blue garbage bags to avoid them becoming windblown
- All cardboard and paper shall be placed in front of their property, at the road's edge on the morning of pickup from 6 – 10 am
- NO CARDBOARD OR PAPER WASTE SHALL BE STORED ALONG SIDEWALK OVERNIGHT
- . NO CARDBOARD OR PAPER WASTE SHALL BE OUT ON NON-PICKUP DAYS

Commingles (glass, can and plastic recycling) are picked up every Friday

- It is recommended to place all commingle recycling in clear or blue garbage bags to avoid them becoming windblown
- All commingles shall be placed at the road's edge on the morning of pickup from 6 10 am
- . NO COMMINGLE WASTE SHALL BE STORED ALONG SIDEWALK OVERNIGHT
- . NO COMMINGLE WASTE SHALL BE OUT ON NON-PICKUP DAYS

#### Pitch-In Cans

- . No household trash or regular garbage shall be placed in or around Pitch-In cans
- No card board or paper waste shall be placed in or around Pitch-In cans
- . No commingle waste shall be placed in or around Pitch-In cans
- PITCH-IN CANS ARE FOR PEDESTRIAN REFUSE ONLY

Failure to adhere to these guidelines may result in fines and/or legal action against your establishment and/or property. Dumping is a misdemeanor and punishable by imprisonment



  - Special schedules for special events held in downtown






#### **2025 Parking Plans**

 Work with City of Peekskill to install better parking signage at Nelson Avenue and James Street parking garages; checking on lighted signage










#### 2025 Flea Market Plans
